
## When does a PCBU need to notify the WHS regulator of their plan to process legacy engineered stone?

Legacy engineered stone includes any engineered stone benchtop, panel, or slab that is already installed and, for the purposes of disposal, includes engineered stone benchtops, panels and slabs which are not installed (such as a stockpile). **Processing**, in relation to legacy engineered stone, means using a power tool or other mechanical plant (e.g. a crushing machine) to crush, cut, grind, trim, sand, abrasive polish or drill the engineered stone.
